

Renewable Careers Expo



As the world grapples with solutions to a changing climate, renewable energy technology and advanced manufacturing will be the pathway to decarbonizing the global economy. Tasmania can lead the globe with the manufacture and use of hydrogen and its derivatives through the expanded use of renewable energy, giving Tasmanians a unique opportunity to expand their career horizons to previously unthinkable levels.

What is it?

The Renewable Careers Expo is a hands-on one-day expo delivering career options for secondary students, job seekers and those seeking to change careers. The intent is to immerse those interested in renewable energy-based careers with activities and demonstrations that illustrate the scope of career options in the renewables sector.

Who is it for?

The expo is in two parts – a four-hour window between 10am and 2pm for secondary school students from year seven to 12 and a two-hour window between 4pm and 6pm for those interested in a new career in renewables or for job seekers looking to enter the renewables sector. It is envisaged that schools would attend for around 90 minutes and BBAMZ is flexible in supporting schools to attend at a time best suited to them.

Why are we doing this?

To expose students, job seekers and those looking for career changes to the wide diversity of career opportunities that exist, or will soon exist, in the renewable energy and manufacturing sectors.

How will it work?

People attending the expo will be able to actively engage with a range of technologies such as hydrogen electrolyzers and fuel cells along with the advanced welding simulator and other demonstrations. Rather than being simply an exercise on distributing pamphlets and other collateral, the aim of this event is to actively engage with a hands-on experience.

Where will this event be?

The initial event will be in the George Town Memorial Hall, which is the town closest to the Bell Bay Advanced Manufacturing Zone. Bell Bay is seeing strong growth in advanced manufacturing capability and is the site most likely to see the first large-scale hydrogen export manufacturing facility.

What else is there?

To assist schools to engage with the event, BBAMZ will fund bus transport for northern schools to attend the event. There is no charge to attend, but we do ask that schools register by October 12 to ensure that we have capacity and to ensure compliance with COVID 19 requirements.
